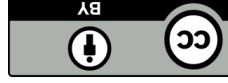

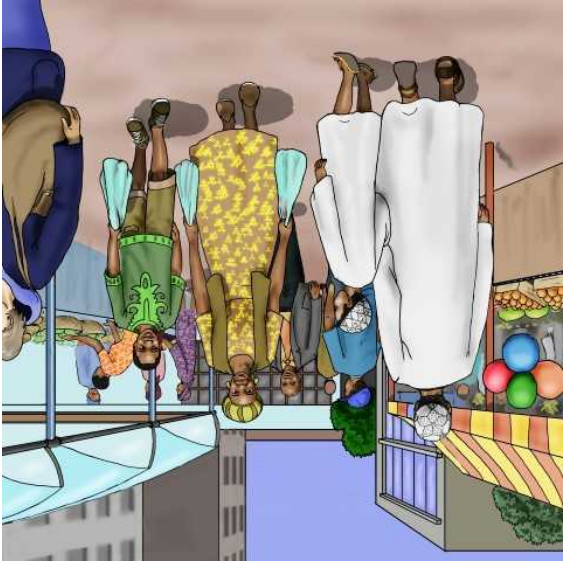

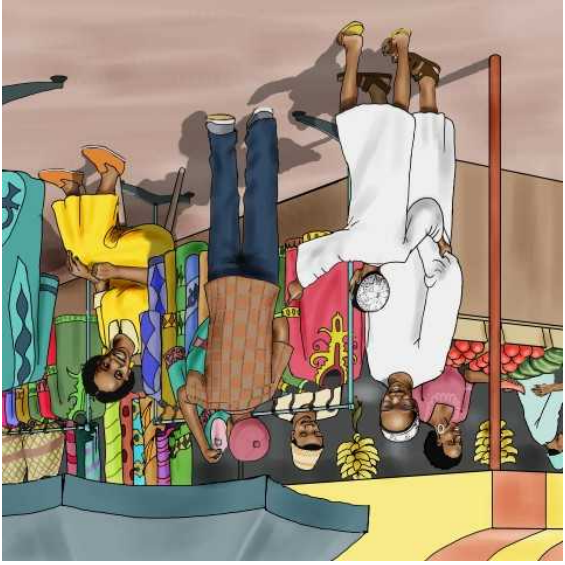
“I wish I had a shirt like that boy,” says Hamisi.
