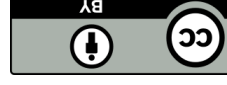

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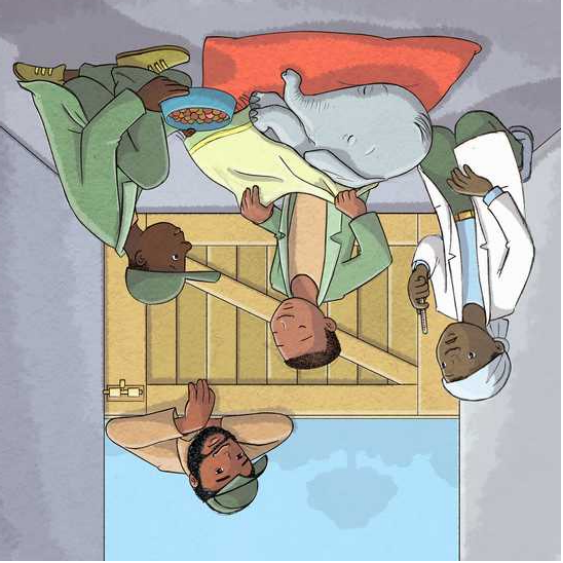

But soon, Nomsa got stronger. She began to play with the other animals.



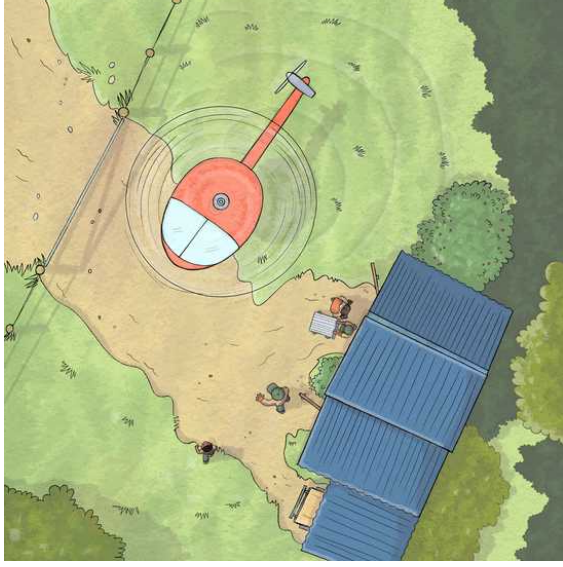

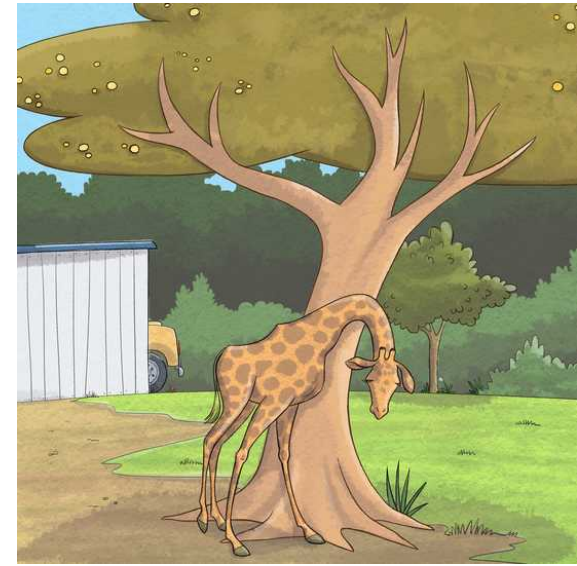
Ndiwa was five days old. Keeper fed Ndiwa with
